



## What's the Problem?


- 25,000 infant deaths/year due to SIDS
- 60% of parents sleep with their infant(s)
- Existing sleeping environments do not provide 360° protection

## Revolutionizing Infant Sleep Safety

#### **Possible External Devices:**

**Software Application** – receives/emits alerts, receives/displays sensor data (temperature, breathing, motion), arms/disarms pod, and controls lights/sounds.

## **Expected Market**

- Middle-Class mothers and fathers
- 60% of parents sleep with their babies
- 4 million births in US annually
- \$17.8 billion market in the U.S. for juvenile products






## Revenue Model: B2C

Pricing Structure in process (~\$99-299)

In-bed sleepers \$45-\$62
Bassinets: \$45-\$300
(None include technology)

Angel-type Monitors: \$75-\$250 Parents: \$50 more for sensors

## **Three Primary Customer Segments:**

Middle class parents ages 20-36 (n = 70 surveyed)

### Product A

#### Basic (No Sensors)

- \$65 (Shelf Price)
- Experienced parents who have slept with their babies previously

## Product B

#### Night Light + Blanket Detector

- \$87 (Shelf Price)
- Parents who worry about blanket ingress

## Product C

#### **Smart Position Monitoring**

- \$108 (Shelf Price)
- First time parents


