A UWM Entrepreneur's Personal Quest to Battle Antibiotic Overuse by Jessica Silvaggi

Motivated by a family tragedy, UWM Professor Ching-Hong Yang developed a groundbreaking biopesticide and founded startup T3 BioScience to get it to market.



In this interview, Dr. Yang shares his story.

JS: Dr. Yang, you've previously shared that your personal experience with your father's battle against antibiotic-resistant infection inspired you to establish T3 BioScience. Can you elaborate on this experience and how it motivated the founding of your company?

CHY: My journey towards founding this company, T3 BioScience, is deeply personal and stems from an incredibly challenging time in my life. My father battled an infection that,

raise an additional \$38.3 million in grants and investments for a remarkable 6.6-fold return on investment. tragically, was resistant to multiple antibiotics. He ultimately lost his fight against the infection. This experience was heartbreaking. It made me aware of the dire consequences of antibiotic resistance, a growing global health concern.

This personal tragedy ignited in me a passion to seek alternatives to traditional antibiotics, especially in the agricultural and food industries where their overuse is particularly prevalent. I realized the urgency of developing sustainable and effective solutions that do not contribute to the problem of antibiotic resistance. This became the driving force behind establishing my company.

In the past, his data analytics expertise has helped a mortgage company assess the credit risk of its borrowers, a software company analyze the impact of its use on customer sales, and a commercial airline to optimize its passenger revenue. Tell us about your key areas of expertise.

GS: My background is in data analytics. Today, companies have great data. But there is often a problem in analyzing it. How do you extract valuable information from the data for decision making?

I have expertise in business, economics, and statistics. This combined with my research experience managing large and complex databases makes me uniquely positioned to help companies in this area.

Which sectors are you most interested in working with?

GS: The financial sector is an obvious one given my background in financial economics. I'm also very interested in the healthcare sector. The US is quite unique and is more complex than other healthcare sectors that I have seen overseas. It has many moving parts. I am keen to help US healthcare companies understand both the financial side of things and how they can use the data to improve health outcomes as well.
